(3) SYLLABUS

The module aims at approaching the refugee crisis in a distinctly sociological manner. Initially emphasis will be placed on definitional clarifications which relate to the legal and historical differences between refuge flows and other migratory movements. After this the module will focus on the recent refugee crisis emphasizing on the following three dimensions. 1) The causes for the rise in the recent refugee flows and their connection to the international organization of the economy and geopolitical interests in the region. 2) An analysis of the main pillars of the European refugee policy and its consequences on integration or exclusion of refugees. 3) A focus on the consequences of the refugee policy on the local level, with particular emphasis on Greece and Lesvos.
